Conclude this remarkable tour with a visit to the historic town of **Arrowtown** and the scenic **Edith Cavall Bridge** before arriving in **Queenstown**, the "Jewel in the Crown."

TUE 7 Wellington – Dunedin – The Catlins

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This morning, we arrive in Dunedin and meet our driver to begin our journey south to the stunning Catlins Forest Park—one of New Zealand's least explored and most captivating regions.

In this untouched paradise, native forests meet the crashing waves of the Pacific Ocean, forming a landscape of hidden waterfalls, dramatic cliffs, and tranquil river valleys. The Catlins offers breathtaking views and remarkable wildlife encounters, making it a haven of wonder and serenity.

Our first stop is Balclutha, the gateway to the Catlins, before continuing along the Southern Scenic Route. This coastal journey immerses us in the rural charm of one of New Zealand's most pristine areas, where golden beaches, native forests, and rugged cliffs abound. Keep an eye out for playful dolphins and sea lions basking along the shorelines.

During our time in the region, stops will include:

- The largest town in the Catlins, **Owaka**
- Kaka Point a charming seaside village
- A short walk-through mature beech forest, to the three-tiered
 Purakaunui Falls a true icon of the Catlins, this is one of New
 Zealand's most photographed waterfalls, gracing many
 calendars, postcards and book covers.
- Tautuku Bay an easy stroll to a pristine white sand beach with sweeping views
- At Curio Bay see one of the world's most extensive and least disturbed examples of a Jurassic fossilised forest. The tree fossils you see here, similar to Kauri and Matai, are approximately 170 million years old. The forest was alive when New Zealand was part of Gondwanaland.
- Visit Curio Scape for the interactive Gateway Experience learn about the region's ancient geological beginnings, the forces of nature; how people have transformed life on the coast many times and how the area has experienced great riches, great loss and regrowth.
- **Slope Point** the most southerly point on the South Island of New Zealand. On a fine day, there are good views of Stewart Island/Rakiura, Bluff and the Tiwai Point aluminium smelter.
- The seaside village of **Pounawea**, an area popular with birdwatchers.

- Queenstown Sightseeing: Discover the "Adventure Capital of the World," including a visit to the charming gold-mining town of Arrowtown.

Some locations in The Catlins may be visited on different days. Other stops and walks may also be included. Most stops include a short walk.

Today, we conclude our exploration of the Catlins region, soaking This morning, enjoy a leisurely start with time to explore Oban Village in its final breathtaking landscapes before journeying south to at your own pace. Wander its charming streets, browse local shops, Invercargill, New Zealand's southernmost city.

On arrival, we visit the impressive Bill Richardson Transport World, a world-class attraction featuring over 300 trucks and classic vehicles, more than 150 vintage petrol bowsers, and extensive motoring memorabilia spread across 15,000 square metres.

Next, we explore the **E Hayes Motor Works Collection**, home to Burt Munro's legendary World's Fastest Indian Scout. This and other seabirds, as sightings are common. THU 9 Invercargill - Stewart Island

This morning, we travel to Bluff, where we board a catamaran for the scenic journey across Foveaux Strait to Stewart Island. On arrival, it's a short walk to our accommodation, followed by a visit to the Department of Conservation (DOC) headquarters in Oban to learn more about the island's unique environment and history.

After time to refresh we join a local guide for a Village and Bays Tour, sharing this experience with other travelers. This informative tour offers fascinating insights into Stewart Island's rich community life, Māori legends, and unspoiled natural beauty. Along the way, enjoy plenty of opportunities for photos and short walks. Highlights include:

- The Rakiura National Park entrance at Lee Bay
- Stunning views of Halfmoon Bay and Horseshoe Bay

The remainder of the day is free for you to explore the island at Beach, set in a picturesque location that spans Jacob's River your own pace. Tonight, we come together for a group dinner at Estuary. Riverton's surrounding beaches and estuary are natural the iconic South Sea Hotel, enjoying the relaxed atmosphere and playgrounds for local residents. Nearly 200 years old, Riverton is reflecting on the day's discoveries.

At midday, we board a modern catamaran for a scenic cruise of Paterson Inlet, offering a stunning perspective of Stewart Island from the water. As we glide past hidden coves and unspoiled beaches, our skipper and nature guide provide fascinating commentary on the island's early Māori history, European settlement, and whaling heritage. Keep an eye out for wildlife, including fur seals, penguins,

and diverse plant life. We disembark for a 45-minute guided walk with a nature specialist through lush podocarp forest, where you'll Tonight, we dine together, reflecting on an incredible day of encounter native flora and fauna, including the curious weka often seen along the beach.

Note: Prepare for an overnight stay on Stewart Island by packing a light Afterward, relax on board as we complete the cruise around Paterson remainder of the afternoon is yours to enjoy at leisure.

SAT 11 Stewart Island – Te Anau

We start the day with an early morning ferry crossing from Stewart Island back to Bluff, where we rejoin our coach. Our first stop is Stirling Point, the southernmost point of mainland New Zealand and the starting (or ending) point of State Highway 1. Stirling Point is famous for its iconic signpost, displaying the distances to major cities around the world—a perfect spot for photos. From Bluff, we travel west through Invercargill to join the Southern Scenic Route, celebrated as one of the world's most remarkable undiscovered drives.

Our journey then heads inland again before meeting the coast Breathtaking vistas of Paterson Inlet from Observation for a stop at the seaside town of Riverton. Fondly named "Riviera of the South", Riverton is nestled at the western end of Oreti the oldest Pākehā settlement in Southland and one of the earliest European settlements in New Zealand. The rocky coastline, great sandy beach and surf attract people to nearby Colac Bay.

> Leaving the coast behind we head north to Tuatapere, a town steeped in sawmilling history and home to a fascinating logging museum and quaint relics of its pioneering past. From here we continue inland on our scenic drive through to Te Anau, the gateway to Fiordland National Park and our home for the next two nights.

> Dinner tonight will be enjoyed at our accommodation, rounding off a day filled with remarkable scenery and rich history.



SUN 12 Doubtful Sound Excursion

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This morning, we take a short drive to **Pearl Harbour** at **Lake Manapouri**. Here we board a comfortable launch and take a scenic cruise across the lake's crystal-clear waters to **West Arm** before boarding our coach and crossing the alpine route of **Wilmot Pass**, passing through some of Fiordland's lush and most dense rainforest. Here we catch our first glimpse of **Doubtful Sound** before descending to **Deep Cove**.

Our **Doubtful Sound cruise** takes us through the tranquil waterways of this remote and majestic fiord. Surrounded by alpine scenery, cascading waterfalls, dense rainforest, and rugged mountains, the journey offers plenty of opportunities to spot wildlife, including **bottlenose dolphins**, **fur seals**, and, in season, the rare **Fiordland crested penguin**. Throughout the cruise, knowledgeable nature guides provide fascinating insights into the region's natural history and wildlife. A **picnic lunch** is served onboard, allowing us to relax and soak in the serene beauty.

At the end of the cruise, we retrace our journey across **Wilmot Pass** and **Lake Manapouri** to **Pearl Harbour**, where we rejoin our coach and return to **Te Anau** for the evening.

Dinner tonight will be enjoyed together at the hotel restaurant, offering the perfect end to a remarkable day in Fiordland.



MON 13 Te Anau - Queenstown

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This morning, we depart **Te Anau**, traveling through an area dotted with deer farms, a hallmark of the region, before crossing the rolling farmland of Southland. The terrain transitions to a more rugged landscape, with tussock grasslands dominating the scenery. Passing through **Kingston**, at the southern tip of **Lake Wakatipu**, we wind along the spectacular **Devil's Staircase**, offering dramatic views of the lake and surrounding mountains, before arriving in the stunning resort town of **Queenstown**.

Nestled among majestic mountains and set on the shores of crystal-clear **Lake Wakatipu**, Queenstown combines natural beauty with a vibrant energy. Renowned as New Zealand's adventure capital, it offers endless opportunities for exploration and excitement. But Queenstown is just as celebrated for its indulgent side, with world-class wine, cuisine, and rich gold-mining history.

Upon arrival, we take a **sightseeing tour**, starting with a visit to historic **Arrowtown**. Nestled below rugged peaks, this charming town is steeped in history. Stroll down **Buckingham Street**, lined with heritage buildings that now house boutiques, galleries, cafés, and restaurants. You may also wish to visit the **Arrowtown Chinese Settlement**, a well-preserved tribute to the Chinese goldminers and businesspeople who contributed to the region's history.

On our way to Queenstown, we stop to admire the historic **Edith Cavell Bridge**, which spans the dramatic canyon of the **Shotover River**. Afterward, we take a drive through Queenstown before arriving at our hotel.

This evening, we gather for a **farewell dinner** at a local restaurant, celebrating the incredible journey we've shared and reflecting on the unforgettable experiences of our tour.
